Course Description

The object of this course is to enhance the ability and skills of the student to correctly identify, detect, and successfully through safety protocols, seize the drug fentanyl and other synthetic opiates. Students will also participate in a practical exercise involving a pill milling operation and make counterfeit pills using non-toxic materials.

Instructors

E. Mick Mollica – E. Mick Mollica is a 30-year veteran in law enforcement, serving 9 years as a police officer and 21 years as a Special Agent Supervisor for the CA Department of Justice, Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement. He worked numerous assignments and has received awards for his work in heroin, cocaine, marijuana and other drug undercover operations.

He is the president & CEO of LEARN Associates Inc., a company that specializes in drug law enforcement training. He has trained over 45,000 students throughout the United States, Central America, Soviet Union & Europe. He has testified as an expert in Federal and State courts in numerous jurisdictions and other states. He was an Adjunct Faculty for 15 years in the Administration of Justice Department at Sierra College, Rocklin, CA where he was recognized as “Professor of the Year” in 2005.

He is a consultant & contractor for the Department of Defense, CA POST, Bureau of Justice Assistance, COPS Program, & Fox Valley Technical College in Wisconsin. He is a Lifetime member of CNOA. He is a U.S. Marine Corp veteran, serving as a Battalion Chief Scout for 3rd Marines, where he was awarded the Combat Action ribbon, good conduct medal, a meritorious field promotion and the Purple Heart.

He is considered and is utilized as an expert in narcotic investigations and substance abuse training.

Mick is the 2108 recipient of the CNOA Lifetime Achievement Award.

Gil Van Attenhoven - Gil Van Attenhoven has over 29 years of law enforcement experience. He began his career with the Sacramento County Sheriff’s Department and spent the next 26 years with the CA Department of Justice, Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement (BNE). He held assignments in the Los Angeles and Redding Field Offices, was a Drug Task Force Commander and the Commander of the Campaign Against Marijuana Planting (CAMP) program, a statewide marijuana eradication task force. He retired as a Sr. Special Agent in Charge for DOJ.

From January 2013 – December 2018, he was the Director of Training for the CA Narcotic Officers’ Association (CNOA).

He is currently an instructor for the Department of Defense Counterdrug programs (MCTC, RCTA, WRCTC), the COPS Office, Bureau of Justice Assistance, CNOA and the National Criminal Justice Training Center. He was the president of CNOA in 2009 and is a Lifetime Member. He also graduated from the FBI National Academy, Class 209. He was appointed to the CA Commission on POST by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger. He was an Adjunct Faculty for 11 years in the Administration of Justice Department at Sierra College, Rocklin, CA.

He is the 2017 recipient of the CNOA President’s Award.
